LAST NAME, FIRST NAME= The Name of every Person whose usual place of abode on the 1st day of June, 1860, was in this family

RACE= Color (white, black or mulatto)

OCCUP.= Profession, Occupation, or Trade of each Male over 15 years of age

REAL VAL.= Value of Real Estate owned

PERS VAL.= Value of Personal Estate owned

BIRTHPLACE= Place of Birth, Naming the State, Territory, or Country

MRD.= Married within the year

SCH.= Attended School within the year

R/W= Persons over 21 yrs of age who cannot read & write

DDB= Whether deaf & dumb, blind, insane, idiotic, pauper, or convict.
